From the Rector's Desk

Christian Stewardship as an act of Thanksgiving

Over the next four Sundays, we shall revisit the concept of Christian Stewardship. Our Stewardship Committee under the joint leadership of Byron Greene and Edith Onyeozili, has decided that there will be four separate addresses delivered, with each underscoring the main theme, that as followers of Christ, we are stewards of the bounty our generous God has bestowed upon our lives. As per usual, we shall be challenged to make formal commitments (sign pledge cards) and these will be offered up before God on Sunday, January 28, 2018.

Appeal for the Kearney Center-Last Wednesday evening, a good representative team from the parish family were on hand to serve the homeless brethren who gathered. Today we issue an appeal for supplies. If you are unable to be part of this ministry, you can assist by making donations of bathroom tissue, socks and toiletries.

Remembrance Project-The parish of St. John has invited us to partner with them for a project that seeks to remember four African American men who were lynched here in Tallahassee between 1897 and 1937.
