

From the Rector's Desk

A Busy Time

2018 has begun, and we find ourselves as a parish family having (to use an old expression) several irons in the fire. We are in the midst of a stewardship program that is seeking a major commitment from all of us (see Senior Warden Byron Greene's visionary statement issued on Thursday of last week). In a matter of days, representatives from the parish will be joining with our Bishops, priests, deacons and lay representatives for the 175th Diocesan Convention to be held in Jacksonville. I do ask that you make special intercessions this week for all who will be in attendance – pray that the Holy Spirit will be present in all of our deliberations and decision making. Our Diocese is at a critical juncture; many feel we are entering upon a renaissance period, a time of renewal and reordering of priorities as a church. Then we shall be on to our annual parish meeting now scheduled for February 18, 2018 which will immediately follows the celebration of the Eucharist that day. Again I claim your prayers for those who will be offering themselves for leadership positions in our congregation. Our Diocesan regulations and parish by-laws dictate that those who after serving their term on vestry, be allowed to step away, thereby making room for others to take their places.

Let me end by saying that we are already facing a calendar that will challenge our stewardship of time, a pressing situation that cries out for the utilization of all the talents our God has blessed us with as a congregation, and the treasure, that we must give to His church, so that the ministry we have the privilege of sharing, prospers.

May our good and gracious God bless and keep us always.
