From the Rector's Desk

Lent is Here!!

Our 40 days observance began on Wednesday of last week, as we joined with Catholics and Protestants alike in this age old custom. Lent is the bigger of the two penitential seasons we have as a church, with Advent being the other. Quite noticeably our altar and other hangings used during this season is always draped in purple. In the more traditional churches (such as ours), Rite I of the liturgy is used for the celebration of the Eucharist. Additionally all celebratory activities are put on hold, so this means that weddings for instance will not be celebrated until Easter comes. I hope that we also remember that Sundays are not days of Lent, for if we did include them, we shall have more than forty days!!!

So yes, Lent is here, and Mother church expects us to observe this solemn season, by turning aside from that which occupies our time on a regular basis. I still do remember that in the early days of my ministry, a former senior warden would say to us, that he was "Lenting", meaning that he was going to avoid all strong drinks and try to be in bed by 9:00 pm!!! His wife Gloria, jocularly asked me one day, if it were possible to extend the Lenten Season, seeing that her Arthur, was truly a darling of a husband for the forty days of Lent! The church says no to that suggestion but models this practice of piety on the forty days our Lord wandered alone in the wilderness to be "tempted by the devil." So, whatever your preferred act of penitence, I pray that our God would grant you the grace to accomplish it. Some of us will fast (get your doctor's permission, please) some of us will pray more intentionally while others perform acts of charity. Lent of necessity dictates that we focus less on ourselves and more on Jesus and what he asks us to do for Him.

As I have grown older in the faith, my preferred approach to observing Lent has been to do something more for Jesus. So rather than withdraw from those around me, I engage more. I do more visiting, more sharing and more listening. So don't be surprised if you get a call from me saying that I shall be at your home sometime during the Season, just so we can fellowship away from church. If I can offer any encouragement this Lenten Season, it would be that we all shrive to get closer to the Lord and to feed on His word. The Psalmist David said it best, "thy word is a lantern unto my feet and a light unto my pathway." Let the Lord lead us unto a more fulfilling relationship with him beginning this Lent and watch how our relationship with others significantly improve.

Wednesday Evenings in Lent

Each Wednesday evening we shall gather for fellowship and shared times of reflection. Four of our parishioners have been invited to help us reflect. Our theme for Lent 2018 is, My Life, My Jesus and Me. Do come and enjoy table fellowship and whatever else the evenings provide. Sometime during the course of the Season, we shall exchange visits with the Church of the Advent. A Happy and Holy Lent to all.
