

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From the Rector's Desk

Doing things Differently

The Lenten Season brings changes to the liturgical life of Episcopal congregations. In the more traditional parishes (such as ours), we revert to Rite I for the celebration of the Eucharist. We normally omit the alleluias and glorias from our services, and even the bells remain silent. Our services are more tempered, even though Sundays are not properly days of Lent. Again in most parishes, Wednesday evenings are typically used for reflection, utilizing non-liturgical services. I invite you to join us for our own observance each week in the Fellowship Hall, as a member of our congregation, shares his or her faith journey.

It is also customary for us the clergy to attend a retreat/workshop/seminar soon after the Lenten Season begins. During the course of this two day activity, we fellowship, pray and reflect together on some pertinent religious issue. This Lent our retreat leader was Dean Kate Moorehead of St. John's Cathedral, who offered spiritual insights into the life of Mary Magdalene, a traveling companion of the Lord Jesus. She asked us to disabuse our minds of all the supposed characterizations we have of this remarkable woman. The perception we have of this female disciple is not healthy with many identifying her as a prostitute (the person in the gospels who anointed Jesus with perfume) or the woman from whom Jesus drove out seven demons! Kate invited us to look at Mary of Magdala through different eyes, and instead, as part of the group of women who ministered to our Lord and his disciples.

Bishop John Howard always has his own challenge to present to us serving clergy. This time he encouraged those gathered to make our worship services more meditative, utilizing periods of silence after we have heard from God – after the readings, the sermon and the celebration of the Eucharist. He went so far as to suggest that we should make communion hymns optional! So after we have made our communion, we return to our places and ponder on what God continues to do in the lives of us His people. The Bishop also suggested that we should make greater use of the Prayer Book, utilizing the Offices of Morning and Evening Prayer that have now fallen into neglect. And finally he suggested that he would like to see greater use made of Private Baptism – the Prayer Book actually offers this as an option. Going forward my intention is to make greater use of our Worship Leaders – Charlie Clark, Delois Brown and James fort, as we incorporate Morning Prayer into our Sunday worship. In the spirit of doing things differently, we shall be making use of the Great Litany, a penitential rite that replaces the Prayers of the People in our Sunday worship during the Lenten Season.

Finally, when the Lent comes to an end, I would be sitting with our Music Team, to see how best we can inject more spirit/life into our services therefore increasing participation in the hymn singing of our congregation.
