Happy 135th, St. Michael!



On September 29, 2017 ST. MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS EPISCOPAL CHURCH will observe 135 years of ministry. To some, this may not seem like a big deal, but if you know a little about our church's rich history, you will understand the importance of this milestone.

"Good things are happening at St. Michael.

Come and see!"

St. Michael began with the planting of a missionary seed in 1882 by Bishop John Freeman Young, the second bishop of the Diocese of Florida. Bishop Young called Rev. Jacob R. Ballard, the second Black ordained to the deaconry in the Diocese of Florida, to organize a congregation in Tallahassee. Throughout its history, our church has actively labored in the community it serves to spread the good news of the gospels, and to uphold the name of its patron saint – Michael, The Archangel – by steadfastly working to defend truth and justice.



During its early years, St. Michael had no regularly assigned priest and was served by visiting priests from nearby parishes, primarily St. John's in Tallahassee. It was not until 1947, when The Reverend David Henry Brooks came to Tallahassee as vicar of the church and Episcopal Chaplain at Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University, that St. Michael began a continuous ministry. During the Civil Rights Movement of the 1950s and 60s, Fr. Brooks was a leader in the Tallahassee community.

St. Michael achieved parish status on May 22, 1977 and The Reverend James H. Hall, who succeeded Father Brooks in 1974, became the church's first Rector. Since then, St. Michael has been served by four other rectors and several interim rectors/priests-in-charge, including The Reverend Calvin Goodlett, who has been the Interim Rector at St. Michael since 2014.

ministry. Please continue to give generously.


FLIP FLOP SUNDAY —St. Michael's fifth annual Flip Flop Sunday Service and

CONGRATULATIONS to former Vestry member Dr. Ebenezer Oriaku who was elected to the Florida A&M University Sports Hall of Fame! Dr. Oriaku was inducted into the Hall of Fame on Friday, August 25 during ceremonies and dinner held at the Al Lawson Multipurpose Center and Teaching Gymnasium on the FAMU campus. Joining Dr. O in celebrating this honor were family members who reside in Britain, his friends and colleagues at FAMU, and members of his church family.



PRAYING AND GIVING FOR TEXAS — In a letter to everyone in the Diocese of Florida, Bishop Howard asked for continued prayers and assistance for the people of Texas. Bishop Howard wrote:

"...the strongest and most important way for us to reach out to our distressed brothers and sisters is in prayer, asking God to be present with those affected by this natural disaster."

"The most immediate need is to fund those in distress and those assisting them. Financial gifts to support the work of Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD) will be the best way for us to achieve this kind of important support and I invite you to contribute generously. Either way, you will be touching the lives of those affected by Hurricane Harvey and you will make a difference."
