A Message from Our Rector



2017 has truly been a wonderful year for our small but dynamic congregation, as we faithfully ministered to all who joined us, and even those beyond our parochial boundaries. A casual glance at our interactions with Grace Mission, Church of the Advent and the Kearney Center bears testimony to this claim. However, it was our 135th Anniversary celebrations that proved to be the highlight for all we attempted together. Junior Warden Charlie Clark and the team that coordinated the celebrations truly did themselves proud. Together they helped us to pause and reflect on the manifold blessings we have received at the hands of a benevolent God. As fate would have it, my family and I arrived just in time to share in the festivities planned over a three-day weekend.

Throughout this celebratory time, we sought to remember the efforts of those who served as both clergy and lay here at St. Michael, as they utilized their time, talent and treasure. Quite obviously, this celebration served primarily a two-fold purpose: 1) it encouraged us to look back at the amazing journey we are a part of as a predominantly African-

American congregation, and 2) to appreciate the more than significant impact we made here as a church in Tallahassee. Not lost in this historical reminiscence, was the pivotal role played by Michaelites in the 1950's and 60's — a time of great social change and occasional unrest. Inevitably our reflection caused us to look back at the immortal Fr. David Brooks whose agitation for social justice, played such an integral part in his multi-layered ministry. I have heard stories of students coming to Tallahassee as Baptists and Pentecostals, but leaving here as Episcopalians, all because of the style-effect and compassion of Fr. Brooks. So, we paid tribute to him and all the other rectors who served before and after him. This parish owes a great debt of gratitude to them all and to Fr. Cal as well, for he labored as our interim rector, much longer than was initially envisioned. For them we say, to God be the Glory.
