From the Rector's Desk

Lost in Heaven

'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls'. (Matt 11:28-30). Perhaps the most sobering duty for us as priests is to help prepare members of our flock to die-and to go on to be with the Lord. Every time I am called upon to do so, I walk away thinking that one day, someone will be standing over me proclaiming these words from the Book of Common Prayer:-

'Into your hands, O merciful Savior, we commend your servant N. Acknowledge, we humbly beseech you, a sheep of your fold, a lamb of your flock, a sinner of your own redeeming. Receive N into the arms of your mercy, into the blessed rest of everlasting peace, and into the glorious company of the saints in light. Amen.'

These very words were spoken over our sister Dorothy as she prepared to go from this world. Time did not permit me to get to know her well. In fact, much of our contact was in the form of sick calls, whether at the hospital or her home. Those moments were special, and she always seem to reserve a smile for me. You could have sensed her discomfort at times, but yet she made sure that she showed her appreciation, by offering that wide smile of hers. Eugene tells me that as she slipped away, moving from time to eternity, that smile was again present - indeed for the last time. Why would she feel the need to still smile even in that moment? I want to believe that as she looked up, she saw the Lord Jesus beckoning her to come home. Yes, to leave behind the pain and distress of body, the doctors and the various medications/procedures she had to submit herself to. Who knows? Maybe she heard the Lord Jesus say, Dorothy come home, for indeed you are weary and have been carrying heavy burdens. Come and enjoy the rest I have reserved for you. Dorothy had another reason to smile, for as I visited her in the days before she passed, I kept running into family members both hers and Eugene's. I suppose at times Eugene might have felt that he was the owner of a small motel. The voices of those loved ones must have provided comfort to Dorothy's distressed soul. Now Dot is gone home to the one who gave her life. The one who promised her a place in his kingdom, indeed life for ever more, leaving behind Eugene and all those whom she loved so dearly when she sojourned among us. Let us as good Catholics pray for the repose of her soul and ask our great and gracious God to comfort all those who would dearly miss her. May she rest in peace and rise in Glory. Fr. Hugh+
