From the Rector's Desk

On behalf of our entire parish family, it is my distinct pleasure and privilege to welcome the Assisting Bishop of our Diocese, the Rt. Reverend Dorsey Felix Henderson to St. Michael and All Angels. Bishop thank you so much for joining us today.

In the early church, lots of believers were baptized as adults, sometimes along with their whole families. Almost all of us were baptized as infants – Cradle Episcopalians – except for those who have come from other traditions. By virtue of our baptism, we became members of Christ Church, God's own children by adoption and grace, and inheritors of his Kingdom in Heaven. Actually, that's only half of the story. For indeed through our Baptism, we receive the power of the Holy Spirit to help us gain victory over sin and death, thus allowing us to live lives free from fear. Yes, we receive purpose, we receive an identity and we receive the authority to do ministry in the name of Jesus. This is why we can and must boldly proclaim the Good News of the gospel to all those whom we come into contact with. So, as a result of our baptism, we are enabled to grow into the image and likeness of the Lord of our lives. We become as St. Paul the Apostle would have it, imitators of Christ, daily patterning our lives on his. So as a consequence, we find ourselves loving and serving the Lord and our neighbors with unbridled zeal, even if it means sacrificially giving away what we treasure most.

The Church brings us to a better understanding of this life long response to God's love and mercy, by offering us a practical guide to the faith response through the Confirmation Class program. When that period of training is complete, we are ready to be presented to the Bishop. We rightly describe Baptism as the sacrament of beginning. On the other hand Confirmation is the sacrament that opens the door to Christian maturing. The outward and visible sign in Confirmation, is the laying on of hands by the Bishop. Indeed, here again God touches us physically, using the hands of a Bishop. The blessing we receive in Confirmation is the power of the Holy Spirit to lead us in grace all the way to the end of our lives. The Holy Spirit we know is the "comforter". Admittedly, this word "comfort" has undergone great change from its original meaning. In a religious context – "cum forte" means to strengthen. So with the Holy Spirit dwelling in us, we are strengthened to meet the challenges that are sure to come our way as we seek to witness everyday.

Finally, Confirmation is the commissioning we receive to go out and do ministry. Today Akachi, Joseph, Tyler, Hollis and Ama are receiving that privilege. May Almighty God richly bless them as they seek to serve him.
