

From the Rector's Desk

A Brief Meditation

Today's reading appointed from the Book of Job, leaves us with a multitude of questions. Indeed we are left wondering as we ruminate on Job's sufferings, whether there is hope for us human beings. Who will heal the wound of Job? Who will restore all that he has lost? Who will quiet his tormented mind? Who will descend into Sheol to deliver him, if peradventure, he was to die? However, the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that there is a high priest who holds his priesthood permanently (Jesus), and who continuously makes intercession for all who suffer (Heb 7:24-25). He is both the priest who offers <u>and</u> the offering as well. He was like us in every respect, though without sin. He is like us still and evermore, knowing what we suffer and the pain we undergo. He is the one who knows that we weep and who brings consolation. He is the refuge in time of need.

Our gospel speaks today of a man named Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus. He was a blind beggar, forced to rely on the goodness of others. When he heard that Jesus was coming, he began to cry out. Many who were present that day, ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly. Mark says, Jesus stood still and said, "Call him here". I say to you today, stand where you are, for Jesus stands with you. As you do, do not fail to call on him, for he is sure to hear your cry.
