From the Rector's Desk

Celebration Sunday

Today is a special day in the life of our parish family, as we present before the Lord, the pledges we have received in response to our Capital Campaign Appeal. You would remember that this campaign was launched on September 30, 2018 in concert with the celebration we had for the 136th anniversary of our church's founding. The target we set ourselves that day, was audacious, ambitious but absolutely achievable – for indeed, with our God, all things are possible. Unsurprisingly, we are well on the way to the half way mark (\$250,000) and so to God be the Glory. On behalf of our Capital Campaign Committee, let me thank all who responded so magnanimously, obviously spurred on by the words of St. Paul the Apostle, who reminded us how much the Lord loves a cheerful giver.

Do join us in the Fellowship Hall after the celebration of the Eucharist, for a sumptuous meal compliments of our Vestry and the Capital Campaign Committee.

Presiding Bishop's visit to the Apalachee Region

On Tuesday last, I did participate in tele-conference hosted by Bishop Samuel Johnson Howard, that confirmed details for this historic visit to our Diocese. Archbishop Michael Bruce Curry will spend two days in our Diocese (4th & 5th February 2019). He will gather with the clergy and their families and fellowr Episcopalians at St. John's Cathedral in Jacksonville on Monday of that week, before journeying to Tallahassee for an evening service at St. John's Episcopal Church. The next day he will be the celebrant and preacher at Holy Comforter Church School before joining us here at St. Michael's for a special luncheon. I have invited Byron Greene and Alexis McMillan to cochair the committee planning for that event. Needless to say, we want every member of SMAA to be on board for this event. Archbishop Michael is the first African American to lead the Episcopal Church and actually this is his first visit to the Diocese of Florida as primate. Byron and Alexis will keep you informed as plans are developed.

To assist them with that exercise, we will have to have ready signed pledges – our commitment to God for the work of his church especially here at SMAA.
