

From the Rector's Desk

Christian Stewardship – A Final Look

I trust that the sermons preached during this period and the meditations offered via the rector's desk, have afforded us all an opportunity to look at our lives – for we know that we are all stewards, and also, to whom much is given, much is required. I am often reminded of Dietrich Bonhoeffer's description of Jesus who he labelled the man for others. Said Bonhoeffer, he gave his time, (over those three years of ministry), he shared his talent (his gift of healing) and when he had nothing else to give, he gave himself (his life on Calvary's Cross). As stewards, we are all called to pattern our lives after the Christ, who came to show us how to live, love and respond to the goodness of a magnanimous God.

Remembrance Project

On Saturday January 12, 2019, St. Michael and all Angels opened it doors to close to a hundred persons who came from all walks of life, to be part of a dialogue that hopefully will result in this Remembrance Project. This effort originated more than two years ago at St. John's Episcopal Church. First Presbyterian joined in support of this laudable effort, and now there are some 14 organizations/churches who have signed on. In a nutshell, this is a project to create a memorial recognizing four victims of lynching here in Leon County. So in addition to erecting a plaque/marker, the eventual goal is to conduct a service of remembrance and reconciliation, and also to maintain a program of education that will facilitate a continuing conversation regarding the issues of race and justice.

Such was the occasion that featured FAMU history professors Darius Young and David Jackson as well as Kiara Boone, Deputy Director of Community Education for the Equal Justice Initiative. From a personal standpoint, I was encouraged by the size and diversity of the gathering. I pray that that meeting will give further impetus to this project, for our community needs to confront this dark period of our shared history. Indeed the resurgence of hate speech and white supremacism is evidence enough that as one of Faulker's in characters Requiem for a nun said, "The past is never dead. It's not even past."
