From the Rector's Desk

Christian Stewardship – A Second Look

The Stewardship letter that has been sent out around the parish very prominently indicates suggested ways of giving in terms of our treasure. Today I want us to think of the gift of time we have received at the hands of a gracious God -the time to support others and the causes that we sometimes do not give a second thought to.
