From the Rector's Desk

Hope for the Future

As part of my morning ritual, I do the daily office (morning prayer from the Book of Common Prayer). Actually it has become something of a rule of life for me. On Thursday morning of last week, the Old Testament reading came from the prophecies of Isaiah, chapter 29 in particular, in which he speaks of – hope for the future. This was almost a common place theme for the biblical writers, one that even the Apostle Paul resorted to again and again in his epistles. Let us not lose sight of the reason for prophet's warning. In fact, take a step back and listen as Isaiah bemoans the tragedy that was about to befall his people - "you shall be brought low (v4) you will speak out of the ground and your words will rise from the earth; your voice will come like a ghost's from the ground and your words will squeak out of the earth." (think death and total destruction). Fortunately for the people of Israel, Isaiah continued his utterance, but this time offering a word of hope. "The horde of your enemies shall crumble into dust, the horde of ruthless foes shall fly like chaff. Then suddenly, all in an instant, punishment shall come from the Lord of Hosts with thunder and earthquake and a great noise"....all nations warring against God's people will then fade away as a dream, a vision of the night. As we would say today, the people of Israel's nightmare will eventually be over.

Somehow the prophecy of Isaiah offered a signal of hope for a people who were preparing for the worst. I could well imagine the puzzlement this juxtaposition of thought would have caused those who believed they were hearing from the Lord's messenger. What should they expect or rather believe, for Isaiah's God was so angry with his people that he was ready to "put" them to the sword, and yet there was still that message of hope to hold on to, despite his dire prediction.

For some among us, 2018 was a nightmare year, while for others, certainly those in the business sector, something of a banner year of exploding profits. As we bring 2018 to an end, there are still many among us who are unsure of how long the shutdown in Washington DC will last. Who looks forward to uncertainty? Who enjoys going to a land lord or their banker asking for mercy? The answer is none of us. As I pen these few words, I can't help but think of an email that came across my desk from a desperate woman,

Father, you have made all people with eyes to see you at work in the world, ears to hear you cry out when right suffers wrong, when justice is brought low. Give to the people of our nation courage to stand up for goodness and right-doing in the face of an oppressive spirit, and courage to believe we may restore, in accordance with your gracious will, a light to enlighten the nations and the people with your truth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. *Amen*.
