From the Rector's Desk

Giving and Outreach in a Small Church

I ended this column last week by saying that the Rev. Neal Michell's church, gave of themselves after recognizing that that was all they had to give. They however did an interesting thing – they created a list of all the various outreach efforts their membership was involved in. This approach served a two-fold purpose. Firstly, it shared information with those who were on the lookout for opportunities to serve away from the parish. Secondly, and perhaps more importantly it afforded their volunteers to share what joys they experienced as they served. May be on Sunday morning, we could ask Dawn Freeman to tell us more of what is done at Grace Mission and how our homeless brethren receive the acts of love her team provides. I would suggest that Fr. Cal and Karen should consider doing the same, for often we serve more than three hundred (300) persons every first Wednesday at the Kearney Center.

Back to the story- sometimes Mother Nature could cruelly impact certain areas of our world. This past week our friends up north had to deal with bone chilling temperatures unfortunately resulting in loss of life. Nothing so drastic occurred in Neal's parish. However his community was hit by a 500-year flood that decimated certain parts of the parish. Members of Fr. Mitchell's church sprang into action to help in the recovery effort and in so doing earned themselves a new name – "the church that cares". Wouldn't it be wonderful if SMAA came to be known here in Tallahassee as the church that cares? Yes there are always risks of being over exposed and before long lines could begin at our doors. Here's a thought, the same Lord who calls us into his service, often times send us the resources we need, as he did in the case of this small church.

Then they returned to the budget exercise, which we too would have to address at our Annual General Meeting. What those believers did was to allot just one percent for missions and outreach – yes just one percent!! Several members of the vestry objected to such a miniscule amount because they would always set aside 10 percent. It took Fr. Neal and others sometime to point out that although the church had been setting aside 10 percent for the past several years, they had spent nothing. So it would have been better to budget a more realistic figure – could we here at SMAA learn something from that approach? What happened in that parish, was that each year for the next several years, the vestry increased the amount for mission and outreach by one percent and actually spent it – leaving the parish with four (4) important lessons.
