### From the Rector's Desk

## **Another look at Prayer**

I have been reading very slowly, a priceless piece of literary writing – More Beautiful than Before – loaned to me by a parishioner. The author, Steve Leder, is a Jewish Rabbi, whose writing style is breathtakingly beautiful. If it is at all possible, try to pick up a copy of his book for your library. The sub theme of this literary master-piece is – How Suffering Transforms us. But I have chosen to extract the perspective he shares with his readers on Prayer. Rabbi Steve says and I quote:

"I don't think praying to God prevents disasters or cures cancer, because I don't think God causes disasters or gives people cancer in the first place. But I do know that prayer unlocks tears and hidden sorrow. I do not believe in prayers that cure, but I do believe in prayers that heal." Maybe what the good Rabbi says here, would startle us believers, but what he next shares, perhaps better explains why he has arrived at this particular conclusion. He writes, "when I pray for my father, whose Alzheimer's disease will only get worse until he dies. I am not praying for him to be cured. He won't be. I am praying for my family to heal together as we try to protect and comfort my dad as best we can. For our broken hearts to heal. For the healing that comes when we make peace with that which we cannot change." He continues, "most often when I pray, I am not asking for something. Instead I am asking to be rid of something: to be rid of anger, arrogance, and pettiness; to be rid of everything that keeps me from being my best self. I pray in a way that depends not upon God, but upon me. This is true whether I am praying on my own behalf or I am a witness to others, sadness, and I am praying for and with them." He concludes "prayer says to the sufferer on whose behalf we pray – I care about you, I am thinking about you. You are not suffering alone and un-noticed. Prayer is Hope." This is certainly a radical understanding of the prayer concept that we Christians will take a minute to wrap around our heads.

Most of us woke up on Friday morning, only to hear of a mass shooting in New Zealand that took the lives of forty-nine persons in mosques. Those gathered were in the prayer posture when they were killed. Do pray for the families who are left mourning.
