From the Rector's Desk

He is Risen!

The Acts of the Apostles record that the Apostle Paul encountered the Risen Christ on the road to Damascus, accounting for his eventual conversion. Paul reflecting on that experience, recalls how he heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me? "Who are you Lord? Paul asked. The answer came, "I am Jesus whom you are persecuting." It is rather interesting that when he wrote about this encounter in his letter to the church at Corinth, he abandoned the dramatic language of Acts, and instead wrote, "Last of all, as to one untimely form, he (Jesus) appeared also to me." Undoubtedly, this was for Saul (Paul) a rather humbling and some say, humiliating moment in his life; but one that never-the-less proved pivotal for him. Think about it, Saul (Paul) has set out from Jerusalem with authority to arrest all the professing Christians he found there at Damascus, and to bring them back in chains. He did get to Damascus, but as a totally different individual after his encounter with the Risen Christ. We easily remember from scripture how zealous he was as a Pharisee, how self-righteous he appeared and how apparently knowledgeable he was, yet all of that suddenly became unimportant, after he had experienced the Risen Christ. In that moment Saul (Paul) realized that Jesus was alive and that he had truly been raised from the dead - the believers were right when they proclaimed -He is Risen.

That was Paul's story – what is ours? This Easter the church invites us to encounter again the Risen Christ as we worship Him. Our services leading up to today including our mid-week gatherings, did not have a lot of drama, but hopefully they did help us get to a clearer understanding of our shared faith. I pray that we are all more convicted than when we began this journey, forty days ago, and we can say with all our hearts, as the early church believers did, "He lives and dies no more."

On behalf of Genevieve, the girls and Daniel, let me wish you and your loved ones, a Happy and Holy Easter. Let me close by sharing one of the best resurrection poems I have ever come across – An Empty Tomb Instead.

They came to the quiet garden
In the early morning gloom
And there in the shadowed darkness
They found an empty tomb

They thought all hope had ended With Calvary' dying breath But they found a powerful Savior, triumphant over death
