

Standing Together

On Thursday morning of last week, I joined with other members of the Tallahassee Interfaith Clergy, to express our collective support and solidarity with the Jewish Community, in the wake of recent acts of violence at synagogues in Pittsburg and Poway, California. We gathered for that press conference, in the sanctuary of Temple Israel, where the Rev. Dr. R. B. Holmes of Bethel Missionary Baptist Church addressed the local press. Rev. Holmes in his remarks, denounced all forms of anti-Semitism, Islamophobia and all attempts at fomenting hate across our country. Rabbi Jack Rombery who welcomed us clergy to the temple, spoke of the necessity of all people of faith to come together in the face of the rising tide of white supremacy and other hate filled ideologies. He took the time to invite us to join his faith community for their Memorial program scheduled for the very evening, as they recalled the Holocaust (Yom Ha Shoah). It was good to hear of the on-going co-operation between Rabbi Rombery and Pastor Holmes who have actually exchanged pulpits!! As people of faith here in Tallahassee, we need to stand together in the face of this new threat to civil society. Indeed, we have had three (3) incidents of church burnings in Louisiana in recent times and some not so subtle threats remain out there.

It is that time of year when we ask every Episcopalian to give generously, so the ministry of the Episcopal church here in America, could reach into other people's lives – those whom we pray for. I came upon this nugget, last week, as we read together at Tuesday's Eucharist, an excerpt from the Presiding Bishop's book – Crazy Christians. The nation of Barundi in East Africa has emerged from a bloody civil war and so, a sign that sits above their Diocesan Office proclaims, "Peace House". Enquiring about the history of the building, Archbishop Curry was told that it was built from funds raised by the United Thank Offering!
