
We have received word that Chris White is now spoken for! Chris was engaged two Friday nights ago to Sherika Highman. Congratulations to them both.



From the Rector's Desk

A Brief Thought

The first lesson for this Sunday records the reprimand Peter received at the hands of "the circumcised believers" who criticized him for going to the home of a Gentile and actually sharing fellowship with his household. Peter in turn reveals to them a vision he did have prior to his undertaking that journey to Joppa. In that vision, Peter sees a sheet being lowered from heaven with all sorts of "clean and unclean" animals and he is ordered 'to rise, kill and eat! Being one who still observed certain dietary laws, he refuses and is told – what God has made clean, you must not call profane. Of course this was a fare-shadowing of the encounter he would have with his Gentile audience. Peter's prejudice would have prevented him from entering the Gentile Cornelius' residence. The vision however made it crystal clear that all people are part of God's creation and should not be excluded in anyway from his plan of salvation.

Fast forward to 2019, and let us ask ourselves, if maybe inadvertently we may be guilty of excluding others from our lives and even our churches on account of how we can behave at times. Looking closely at that vision we believers see why we cannot hate our neighbors. We have to refrain from the "Us and Them' vocabulary. To quote a certain writer, "the whole creation is the raw material of a New Jerusalem – something of what St. John Divine saw in a vision on the island of Patmos."

Pray for Peace

The sabre rattling that has become more evident over the last few days, should cause us all concern. I am referring to the situation in the Persian Gulf and surrounding nations. Let us pray that the horrors of the Gulf War 2003 – and onward, is not revisited upon us as a nation, nor those who would find themselves near to the theater of war.
