the 120 did not go out into the streets and profess their faith after that life changing experience?

Here's a parting thought, a recently published report suggests that for the next decade, we can expect thousands of Christian churches to be closed here in America and some of them will be Episcopal congregations! How do we avoid this tragedy in TEC? Two words – Church Revitalization.



From the Rector's Desk

Church Revitalization and a revisiting of Pentecost

Across Christendom, we are celebrating today the Feast of Pentecost – the birthday of the Christian Church. The Acts of the Apostles declares (chapter 2:1-4) - "while the day of Pentecost was running its course, they (the believers) were all together in one place, when suddenly there came from the sky a noise like that of a strong driving wind, which filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues like flames of fire, dispersed among them and resting on each one. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to talk in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them power of utterance." And with that the Christian Church was born, as the Holy Spirit descended upon the 120 souls who were gathered in a room there in Jerusalem. A curious detail that we often miss always springs to mind when we peruse the list of those pilgrims who were present that day in Jerusalem. We often forget that Pentecost is actually a Jewish festival -ingathering they call it. So there were many pilgrims who were in town, as. Luke records, Jews and Gentiles from all walks of life including and surprisingly so, some Arabs as well. It is reasonable to conclude that when our God poured forth his Spirit on those who received it, among the recipients were Muslims! Do they have a claim on the Holy Spirit? Try reading the Koran and see what it says. Let's revisit the story. Luke says that the disciples were gathered in one place as they waited. And then the Spirit of God came, infusing new life and new hope and a whole new vision for their lives. Never forget that they were 'holed' up in that room for another reason – fear – and you can add uncertainty. No one was certain what the future held, with just three years of interrupted training, not many felt adequate enough to go into all the world to do ministry. It was at this juncture of their lives when the Spirit came, destroying whatever foreboding that seemed to hold them hostage, and yes setting them free to go for Jesus.

Sometimes I am led to believe that as Episcopalians, we perhaps need our own 'Pentecost Experience'. For it would seem that we are hesitant to share our faith (even speak about to friends) and often leave this whole business of evangelism to others, such as the Jehovah Witnesses and those who are prepared to knock on doors and courageously witness in the face of hostility. So we say, it is not our cup of tea and we should rather wait, for they will come. Could you image what would have been the church's history, if
