#### From the Rector's Desk

### Church Revitalization and a revisiting of Pentecost cont'd

The question under consideration today in this column, is, how do we avoid stagnation and possible decline in our parishes/missions across the Episcopal Church? And as an aside, how do we here at SMAA prevent this blight from ensnaring us?

I believe that a previous reference was made to a recent conference attended by Mtr. Lisa Meriou of All Saints Parish in Jacksonville, where the presenters emphasized the need for stable leadership in parishes, meaning that those who are called into such curacies, must be prepared to stay for at least three (3) years. Instability is counter productive they argued, and uncertainty only serves to hamper community building. They also pointed to the need for accountability at all levels between priests, vestries and congregations, and this ought to be done in love, always. Our vestry here at SMAA has embraced the call of the Episcopal Church to make full use of the Mutual Ministry Review process, that encourages the priest, vestry and the parishioners to look at their corporate life together, to see whether the mission, their raison d'etre (reason for being) to bring others to Jesus is being achieved. Those presenters thought it sufficiently important to sound the alarm over programs that we often become enarmoured by. So we sit around thinking of what else we need to experiment with, what other gimmicks we need to try. The Lord Jesus did not resort to gimmickry, but rather to sought to bring others to the Kingdom, by the faithful preaching of the word. So Lisa said, they were told to go back and remind church leaders, that they are to call for faithfulness – in prayer life, in attendance at worship and in the study of God's word. This is reminiscent of the approach the Early Church took as they tried to bring others to the Way, as Christianity was thus known. And yes, they urged patience. We know from our own lives how impatient we can become when a device or appliance proved unsatisfactory, and how readily we are tempted to dispose of the same. Actually, we live in a time of hurry up and change and what we desired, must be had immediately, if not before. How different are we being expected to respond to the call of God upon our lives? The God whom we seek to serve, expects us to wait upon him as the prophet encourages us to do in Chapter 40:31 of Deutero Isaiah. So if we are going to revitalize our churches, we shall have to learn how to wait on our God and as we wait remain prayerful and patient.
