From the Rector's Desk

In Need of Healing

I sat alone in church Thursday midday waiting to see if anyone would show up for the healing service at 12:15 pm — no one did. However, it was time well spent, for soon my thoughts drifted to the troubling times in which we live. Before heading over, I was reading how another four persons were killed this time in Orange County, California where a knife wielding individual was responsible for this carnage, leaving behind two others injured. Friends there seems to be no respite for us as a nation as we go from one bad news cycle to the next. Most of us are still grappling with what took place over the weekend before where two mindless acts of random violence were unleashed on unsuspecting individuals at a Walmart Store in El Paso, Texas where shoppers were trying to take advantage of bargains — it's that time of year and a bar in Daytona, Ohio where folks were just fraternizing. We lost some thirty-one souls just thirteen hours apart — not to mention the many including children who were traumatized from both incidents.

As I sat there, a wave of helplessness flooded over me. Maybe for good reason no-one came on Thursday so I could take advantage of that "alone time" and listen to the one who heals our wounds, hears our prayers and supplies the "balm" we need in times like these. Yes, the words of that deeply moving Negro spiritual – *Balm in Gilead* – provided temporary solace in that moment. Hear them again –

Sometimes I feel discouraged, And think my life is vain, But then the Holy Spirit Revives my soul again. There is a balm in Gilead To make the wounded whole There is a balm in Gilead To heal the sin sick soul.

Pray with me that that balm will be found and soon, so that true healing can begin in our fractious nation.
