

#### From the Rector's Desk

#### **Remaining Persistent**

Our gospel story this morning, reminds us of another parable that Jesus told about a Persistent Widow. Inherent in this gospel story is a message for all believers, about the way we ought to approach our faith. Far too often we allow ourselves to become discouraged or worse yet distracted, all because of what life often hurls at us. Well, in the story before us, that widow seeking justice, literally wore that judge out as she kept coming back. This ought to be the approach embraced by us as we seek to inculcate a new inward law of Christ that makes us just as determined as the psalmist who developed a love for the law as he daily revisited it (Ps 119:97). "All day long it is in my mind; it is always with me; your decrees are my study; I observe your commandments; I keep your word (Ps 119:97-101)"

The author of 2 Timothy viewed sacred scripture in precisely the same way. So he encourages his readers to return often to the word, whereby instruction is to be had for salvation through faith in Jesus Christ. Let us not lose sight of the instruction offered in this writing, that is we should be persistent in the reading of the word. Paul, whom we feel wrote this epistle, suggests the (regular) reading and study of scripture is vitally important, for it is a means of encountering the living presence of the Lord. In these last days, God is speaking to His people through the word made available to us. Now this encounter will take time and patience, repetition and review- we have to return to it, often.

So take the time, do make the time to read a portion of scripture every day and if possible, visit with the Bible Class that meets in the Brooks Room every Wednesday at 6:00 pm.
