

From the Rector's Desk

'Woke' from Sleep

Those who do not subscribe to our Catholic faith, look quizzically upon our observance of the Advent Season and perhaps wonder why we put ourselves through this drill every year. Here's the simple answer – the readings designated for this season simple do not allow us to do otherwise. If anything, they force us to remain sober, indeed 'woke'. The word 'woke' has taken on a certain significance, indeed it has become something of a concept in recent times for the political and social activists in our midst, who keep saying, that with all that is happening in our country and world, this is no time to sleep, no time to be distracted from the mission at hand, no time to accept without questioning what we see and hear from the print and electronic media. The church instead challenges us to tear our eyes away from the gift buying and the supposed sales and bargains, and instead look at the age-old message of the Advent Season. I was reminded of the four such messages as I read the December issue of The Living Church – Death, Judgement, Heaven and Hell. None of these four cause us any real excitement, except for Heaven; but then look what will it take to get us there!

Let me direct you to the readings appointed for this first Sunday of Advent, which according to a columnist of the Living Church, speaks not of Jesus' arrival, but rather of his final coming at the close of the age. "Watch out then, because you do not know what day your Lord will come..... so then, you also must always be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you are not expecting him" (Matt 24:42-44). The Nicene Creed that we recite at the Eucharist, makes use of a "future participle" to describe the suddenness of our Lord's final coming, describing it this way – "he is about to come and to judge the living and the dead." So we believers are left in no doubt of our Lord's "parousia" or His second coming. The prayers of Consecration (BCP) remind us that – Christ has died. Christ is Risen, Christ will come again, and when we least expect him to!

Listen to what St. Paul that great teacher of the church did say to the believers at Rome, "it is high time to wake from sleep", for the Day of the Lord is at hand, so "let us lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ and make no provision for the flesh to gratify its desires. (Rom. 13:12-14). In short, - Stay woke.
