

From the Rector's Desk

On this second Sunday of the Advent Season, we hear a word from the prophet Isaiah that says in part, 'a shoot shall come forth from the stock of Jesse, one filled with wisdom and understanding, counsel and might, a messenger of peace". This "messenger" is coming to render judgment however for "he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth and with the breath of his lips, he shall kill the wicked (Isa. 11:4)". We are also reminded of the prophecies of John-the-Baptist who also opined, saying, "even now the axe is lying at the root of the tree; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire (Matt. 3:10). As I did last Sunday in this column, I will again avail myself of the thoughts expressed by one of the contributors to the Living Church magazine who made this observation and I quote, "we have in this world, to be sure, human beings who plan and intend harm. There are people who take pleasure in inflicting suffering and misery on others. Indeed there is individual and collective evil to which a civil society cannot turn its back. The innocent and the vulnerable must be protected and there are people who work day and night to do just that, to whom our respect is owed and for whom our prayers and support are needed". One such person is Leah Wiley, who is working feverishly to help us establish a Justice Ministry here in Tallahassee. For after all brethren, there will be no peace if there is no justice – there could not be.

A final thought, as believers we must speak out against every form of evil, in whatever way it manifests itself. We must also find the intestinal courage to face up to it and repent when it does occur in our very lives. Hear what Jesus says to us in the gospel, why do you look at the speck in your brother's eye and ignore the log in your own? Let us continue to be introspective as the Advent Season wears on.
