From the Rector's Desk

Waiting with Expectancy

We Christians have been waiting, and waiting and waiting for the promised Messiah to return. And for most of us, our favorite carol in the Advent Season is – O come O come Emmanuel, that we sing at this time in our services with a great degree of longing. The skeptics and those who generally make light of this hope we hold in our hearts ask, what is delaying his return? They seem to forget what our Lord has promised, that He will return when we least expect him to, maybe like a thief in the night.

Indeed we are forced to wait on almost everything in our lives. For instance we keep waiting for the world to get better, yet almost every day, we receive a fresh dose of frustration and disappointment - yet we keep waiting. We keep waiting for everyone in our families to get on the same page. I tell you, over the years of ordained ministry, I had had to deal with an inordinate amount of requests, persons asking me to pray for better relations between family members. Very often those at variance are deeply religious, but fail to recognize that the vertical relationship we have with our God must be matched with the horizontal one we ought to have with each other – the one does not exist without the other. It is in cumbent on us that we spare no effort when it comes to mending broken relationships particularly in our families even as we wait on the promised Messiah to return. But you know, every now and then we get a glimpse of what is possible. I certainly did a few years ago as I ministered in the Jacksonville area. One day as I was wrapping up a visit with a home bound parishioner and getting ready to enter my vehicle, I heard a voice from across the street call out – Pastor. Looking in the direction from whence the call came, I saw this frail looking gentleman beckoning me to join him. As soon as I joined him, he began telling me that he used to visit St. Philip's, but now his poor health prevented him from doing so. Mind you that part of the city was considered dangerous and I had been previously warned not to linger there. Somehow, I felt comfortable enough doing so that day and before long, others joined the conversation. There was this particular brother who said very little, but kept observing me, almost causing me to become uncomfortable. When he finally spoke, he asked whether I recognized him. I told him not really. He then proceeded to remind me of a particular incident that had occurred some time ago in our Fellowship Hall one Wednesday as we fed the homeless. An argument broke out between these two men over a despicable

comment made about a certain female. A knife was produced and without realizing what I was doing, I jumped between the two men (quite unwisely). Fortunately the temperature was lowered, everyone returned to their seats and we continued with the meal. The gentleman who related the story said to me, that was a brave thing to do – upon reflection I thought foolish. He ended up by saying, that those men are now fast friends, and "will let them know I saw you." I walked away thinking (and promising myself not to engage in that kind of heroics again), that if we wait, our God in his own time will truly make this world a place of love, joy, peace and understanding – the message He wants us to have even as we look for his promised Messiah.
