From the Rector's Desk

Christmas---A Season of Light and Beauty.

At our Christmas Eve service on Tuesday evening, the liturgy had us engage in an age old ceremony of the church called-Candlemas. Together we received the Light of Christ for our unlit candles, taken from the "Christ Candle" that sat surrounded by the other four, which helped us do the Advent countdown. With flickering candles in hand, we heard words that said in part-"the people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death, a light has dawned."

Then the poinsettias that adorned the free-standing altar and the aisles of the church, made us think of the beauty the prophet Isaiah referenced, as he addressed the people of God who at the time were living in exile in Babylon. It was not a good time for God's people, and to add to their misery, those who held them captive, "asked for mirth.: Psalm 137 says; "Those who led us away captive asked us for a song---sing us one of the songs of Zion." To which the Israelites replied, "how can we sing the Lord's song in a strange land?" Despite their disillusionment and deep despair, Isaiah who seemed not to notice, offered words of hope, yes hope. "I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my whole being shall exult in my God; for he had clothed me with the garland of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom desks himself with garland, as a bride adorns herself with her jewels." Strangely enough, the prophet was envisioning beauty for his people as they remained engulfed by pain and distress. The prophet was encouraging them them to look beyond their present circumstances---he continued, "you shall be a crown of beauty again in the hand of the Lord," when your time of misery has come to an end. As we often say, trouble doesn't last always.

The seer's words, written such a long time ago, should offer inspiration and hope to those of us who mourn our present circumstances, political and otherwise, for at the psalmist again reminds us, "sorrow may endure for a night but joy and light and peace, comes in the morning."

Taken together, the message of Christmas is simply this, our God has given His son as the beautiful garments we must put on-so we must seek to live like him, being certain of hope always. It behooves us then to go forth everyday to do good works in His name. As believers we must always seek to build, and raise up others, and help heal whose who are broken and discouraged. The real message of Christmas is about hope, a hope that we believers must never lose sight of despite what our present circumstances may appear to be. Let the Christmas celebration continue.
