From the Rector's Desk

Revisiting our Baptism

On this first Sunday after the Epiphany, the gospel appointed, reminds us of our Lord's baptism at the hands of his fore-runner John-the-Baptist. Indeed the gospels highlight a number of awkward moments in Jesus' life, such as when Mary his mother, tried to get him to help save a bridegroom from embarrassment, as the wine ran out at his wedding party. She asked him to help, to which Jesus replied, "Woman, my hour is not yet come!" To which a confused Mary says to the servants, do whatever he tells you, and walks away. We can also think of when Jesus (St. John 6ff) tells his disciples that he is the bread of life that came down from heaven! Some of those who heard him, declared that this was a hard saying, and as a consequence, walked away from him. Looking at Peter, Jesus asks, "do you want to go too?" To which a bewildered Peter responds, "Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

We have a similar occurrence in the gospel appointed for today, where Jesus "shows up" seeking baptism at the hands of John. This was as we would say today, an are you kidding me moment. A surprised John says as Jesus joins the line, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" John knew who Jesus was, so this was unsettling to say the least! To which Jesus replied, "let it be so for now". St Matthew in telling this story, records that as Jesus steps out of the water, "the heavens were opened to (Jesus) and (John the Baptist) saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on Jesus. John, and perhaps the crowd with him, and by implication all readers of this story, hear a voice saying, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased (Mt 3:17).

Meditating on the Baptism of Jesus should cause us to meditate on our own. Though we may not remember the moment, we may with gratitude trust the good intentions of our parents or guardians, sponsors and godparents and our home congregation who made solemn vows on our behalf and as such, entrusted our lives to God. We all began a journey with Jesus on that particular day, that saw us "clothed ourselves" with the Christ (Gal 3:27). St. Paul argues in that very moment our vocation unfolded, and we became God's children by adoption and grace. More than that, we became witnesses for the rest of our lives. As Paul would argue, "He (God) chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love" (Eph 1:4).

SPECIAL PRAYERS

Father, you have made all people with eyes to see you at work in the world, ears to hear you cry out when right suffers wrong, when justice is brought low. Give to the people of our nation courage to stand up for goodness and right-doing in the face of an oppressive spirit, and courage to believe we may restore, in accordance with your gracious will, a light to enlighten the nations and the people with your truth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. *Amen.*
