#### From the Rector's Desk

#### A few thoughts on King Day

Tomorrow, our nation will again pause and reflect on Dr. Martin Luther King's impact on American Society. There are many who speculate that had King lived a longer life, maybe we would not be witnessing the virulent hatred and divisive politics we are in danger of accepting as normal. His life was cut short by an assassin's bullet that robbed us of what King still had to offer our country back then, and yes certainly the Christian Church, that now seems very much at the crossroads these days. King envisioned a church cast in the prophetic mold. A church that could say unabashedly – thus saith the Lord – and not wonder whether it was speaking truthfully. We could use his wisdom these days as we witness how readily church leaders are making statements, that seem to reflect stark political bias rather than sound theological reflection. Small wonder more and more of our young people in particular, have become so dismissive of what we portend to do as a faith community. Time and again King reference the Healing Balm of Gilead that could heal the sin sick soul, and yes, a nation torn apart because of poisonous political rhetoric that has taken root in our land. From the grave, let King be heard to say again, "Seek God and discover Him and make Him a power in your life. Without Him all of our efforts turn to ashes and our sunrises into darkest nights. Without Him life is a meaningless drama with the decisive scenes missing. But with Him, we are able to rise from the fatigue of despair to the buoyancy of hope. With Him we are able to rise from the midnight of desperation to the break of joy."

#### Stewardship Campaign

We will have today, the third in a series of addresses on Christian Stewardship, and this time delivered by our Senior Warden, Dr. Neil James. Again we ask that each parishioner carefully, and prayerfully complete the stewardship cards/letters that have been in circulation. 2020 will require that each of us, look within our hearts and recognizing how good the Lord has been to us and then show that gratefulness, by contributing the ten percent scripture recommends that we give to God's church.


