

### From the Rector's Desk

#### Lydia ordained Deacon

Last Tuesday evening, Bishop Samuel Johnson Howard ordained to the Order of Deacons, the Rev. Lydia Bush at her home parish of St. Luke's in Live Oak, Florida. Lydia will serve as a vocational deacon in our Diocese, under the direct supervision of the Bishop. Unless there is a change in plan, Lydia will be invited to serve as a "missioner deacon" at a mission that closed back in the 1960's. As we were reminded at her ordination, the historic order of deacons became necessary (as the Acts of Apostles remind us) when a dispute arose on account of the perceived preferential treatment that was being shown to Hebrew widows. The Hellenistic (Greek) believers complained that their widows were not receiving the same treatment as meted to their Hebrew counterparts. Anxious to perceive unity in the infant church, and reluctant to give up on their preaching, teaching and prayer ministry, the apostles decided to call the first deacons into service, to cater to the need of widows and orphans. Those chosen were to be of a good reputation, men of the spirit and who were well respected among the believers. The apostles after praying over them, ordained them to this new ministry. Lydia joins those who in the very first century of the church's life, sought to bring church and community together. Let us her adopted church family keep Lydia in prayers now and always.

## **Black History Month**

The month of February has come to be known and observed in our country as — Black History Month. No doubt, there will be various planned activities that seek to highlight the achievements of African Americans, particularly in the fields of science, sports and politics. Next Sunday, led by the U.B.E., we will pay our own tribute to Rev. Absalom Jones, the first African American to be ordained priest in the Episcopal Church. Later in the month, we anticipate having a special address that will remind us of the extraordinary achievements of people of color.
