From the Rector's Desk

Lent is Here!

We Episcopalians and Anglicans engage in numerous rituals all year long. We are guided by a liturgical calendar that allows us to move seamlessly from one season to the next, embracing the changes required for each. For instance in Lent and Advent, we make use of the Rite One order, omitting the glorias and alleluias from our services. The acolytes have to remember that the bells remain silent, while the Altar Guild, even as they prepare the sanctuary for worship, also remember not to include any floral decoration. Yes, we are that kind of church.

So Lent is here and for us Anglo-Catholics, this season requires us for forty days, to exercise a form of spiritual discipline which demands that we refrain from a lot of what we do as part of our daily routine. Maybe I've said this to you before, but our abstinence ought to be balanced with some do's as well. So yes, there is fasting, praying and self-denial that the Lenten Season proposes we engage in. However, I always think of what more I could be doing for Jesus, myself and others. Let me encourage you to approach Lent 2020 with the same mindset. Accordingly, think of how much more of your time, talent and treasure you could devote to SMAA. Think of other opportunities of volunteering away from SMAA. And where you are so engaged right now, add a little more, so that your efforts are truly sacrificial. Just maybe as you contemplate your own Lenten discipline, remind yourself what the Lord Jesus gave up, so you and I could have a faith.

Hearing from Heaven

This is the theme we shall reflect on when Lent comes on Wednesday (Ash Wednesday). Before we get to that activity there is the Shrove Tuesday (Fat Tuesday) ritual of pancakes and other delicacies to attend to. In passing let me thank the Men's Ministry for again hosting us. Each Wednesday in Lent we will have our midweek gatherings beginning at 6:00 pm with a meager meal, to be followed by a liturgical exercise that will include special addresses by three (3) clergy persons – the Rev. Joe Bakker, the Rev. Lisa Mierow and Canon Wiley Ammons. As part of your Lenten discipline, set aside some time to come and sit at the feet of those invited to address us and where possible, invite your family and friends to come and be inspired.

Finally, the Senior Warder, Neil James has suggested that we make the additional sacrifice of "giving up" a meal, some special treat we afford ourselves. Whatever is the value of that item, place the cumulative amount in the Lenten Self Denial envelopes you will be issued today after the celebration of the Eucharist.

Father, you have made all people with eyes to see you at work in the world, ears to hear you cry out when right suffers wrong, when justice is brought low. Give to the people of our nation courage to stand up for goodness and right-doing in the face of an oppressive spirit, and courage to believe we may restore, in accordance with your gracious will, a light to enlighten the nations and the people with your truth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. *Amen*.
