

From the Rector's Desk

A Lenten Teaching

The first Sunday of Lent, used to be observed by the Church in the West, as the first "day" of Lent and was historically known as "Quadragesima Sunday", because it takes place exactly forty days before Good Friday. It is noteworthy that both the churches in the East and Western world decided that Sundays should not count towards the forty days, so the church fathers, moved the start of Lent to Ash Wednesday. This change to the Lenten Calendar, reflects the church's consistent effort over the centuries to leave room for feasting and celebration during Lent. Actually we Anglicans/Episcopalians see Sundays as a weekly microcosm of Easter - a day for celebrating the Resurrection -hence every celebration of the Eucharist is a little Easter for us. Also for very practical reasons, the Christian church decided not to include Sundays in Lent, since it could easily cause believers to fast for fasting sake. While the fast is typically relaxed on Sundays, the sights and sounds of the liturgy are stripped to a bare minimum. In more traditional congregations, the Great Litany is either read or chanted at the beginning of the Eucharist. Maybe one day we shall introduce that ritual into our worship here at SMAA. Another noticeable change during the Lenten Season comes in the form of the omission of the alleluias (praise the Lord) from our worship. In some churches these alleluias have a yearround presence in the liturgy, so that when it is removed from worship, its absence is felt.

Organizations plan for 2020

At the time of writing, both the E.C.W. and the Men's Ministry did hold their annual meetings, with new persons being invited to serve in leadership positions. We look forward to the installation of those called to serve. With 2020 shaping up to be a banner year for us here at SMAA, I ask your prayers for both of these organizations, as they embark on their individual fundraising efforts. Hopefully we should be able to present the parish with a calendar, that will chart the various efforts to be undertaken.

Lenten Mid-Week Services

For the next five Wednesdays, we will gather in the Fellowship Hall for a simple meal and then go over to the sanctuary for a service and special address. Our speaker this week will be the Rev. Joseph Bakker, parish deacon at St. John's Episcopal Church. In addition to his
