

From the Rector's Desk

A teaching on the subject of Salvation

Let us begin by acknowledging this important Christian belief, that salvation is the work of Jesus. We make use of a strange word to explain what we mean – soteriology – a doctrine that helps us better understand the redemptive work of Christ. This salvation process continues today through the work of all branches of Jesus' church, and that includes us Episcopalians/Anglicans. Have you at some point in your life been asked, "are you saved?" If not, I wonder how you escaped being confronted by your Pentecostal friends!! We've got to go back to the eighteenth century to find the origin of this question. Actually, the Revival Movement that gained ascendancy during that era, taught that in the process of being saved, a person would receive, what is called the consolation – meaning that at a given moment in your prayer seeking to be saved, a warm glow would wash over you. That warm feeling assured you that you were saved. That sort of emotional experience runs counter to the Pauline teaching, found in the New Testament where he says that salvation is process, not some warm fuzzy feeling. We Anglicans/Episcopalians believe that the process of salvation leads us to change and grow, as we mature in our relationship with Jesus.

Our doctrine (teaching) on the subject of salvation identifies four characteristics:-

- 1. we believe that our salvation process begins with our baptism— so we call it the sacrament of beginning. It is through baptism we become members of the church, Christians, and are sealed and marked as Christ's own forever.
- 2. we believe that we are nurtured by the Sacrament of Holy Communion it is the spiritual food (nurture) we need for the Christian journey. Indeed over the past two thousand years the Holy Eucharist has been the focal point for us Catholic Christians.
- 3. we believe that the salvation process requires that we change and grow and most of all mature in our faith. The childlike faith shared with us in Sunday School gives way to a more mature understanding of our relationship with Jesus, the Author and Finisher of our faith.
- 4. we believe the process of salvation requires that we be honest. We must be honest with ourselves. We must be honest with one another. And we must be honest with God. To sum this all up, you and I are on a spiritual journey that will lead eventually to our salvation. For us as a people of faith, repentance is a central to that journey. There are four steps in repentance. 1. We must acknowledge our sins, 2. we need to confess our sins, whether privately or in the presence of a priest. 3. we need to make restitution
