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

The Nicene Creed

The Joshua Generation

Reflections by Shauna Allen

President Barak Obama in his book "A Promised Land" recounts how Dr. Otis Moss, Jr., a veteran of the civil rights movement, called him to offer support and told him he was part of the Joshua Generation. He said that he and others like him were responsible for the next leg of the journey to build on the what the Moses generation had done and lead our people and this country out of the wilderness. He wrote on the profound effect this had on his decisions moving forward with his campaign. He paid tribute to the Moses generation in Selma, Alabama on March 4, 2007 at the funeral of Rosa Parks. He raised a banner for the Joshua generation to follow. This was my inspiration for my study of the book of Joshua and these reflections on the Joshua Generation.

Joshua is one of the historical books of the bible speaking of the faithfulness of Joshua who was commissioned by God to lead his children into the promised land after 40 years in the wilderness. The familiar story of the fall of Jericho has been the inspiration for Lenten meditation and prayer circle faith walks. Obedience to the law, carrying the stones and inheritance are other lessons. But there are other lessons particularly relevant to women that are highlighted in the Women's Study Bible.

The role of women is prominent in Joshua beginning with Rahab, the Canaanite woman and prostitute who hid the Israelite spies placing her family in great peril (Joshua 2:1). Perhaps because of her position she heard of the great things God was doing and learning of his plans for Jericho she hoped to spare her family. God used Rahab to accomplish his purposes and for her faithfulness he granted mercy and grace to her family making her part of his beloved community (Matthew 1:5).

Another lesson in Joshua was the dispensation of lands to the tribes as commanded by God. According to tradition, a man's inheritance went to the family' sons. Zelophehad had no sons, only daughters, Mahlah, Noah, Hoglah, Milcah and Tirzah (Joshua 17:3). His daughters reminded Joshua and the leaders of God's commandment and received their inheritance along with their father's brothers. God's commandment overruled the traditions and granted equal treatment to women.

As I searched the internet for more writings on the Joshua Generation, I came across a blog by Bishop Joseph Mattera. He is the founding pastor of Resurrection Church and leader of the U.S. Coalition of Apostolic Leader and Christ Covenant Coalition. In his blog he describes <u>7 powerful traits of the Joshua</u> <u>Generation</u>. He uses these traits as a call to the church to action similar to President Obama using this theme to call our nation to build upon our inheritance.

1-The Joshua Generation honors the previous generation

Throughout my life I have heard the saying from leaders that we are standing on the shoulders of giants. The giants in my family were my great grandparents, grandparents and mom and her brothers and sisters, all HBCU graduates. Their example of faithfulness, public service and devotion to family shaped my life. I was often asked why I attended the University of Alabama being from Tuskegee. My response is because I could. The first black person to be admitted to the University of Alabama was a woman, <u>Autherine J. Lucy</u>. Her fight led to the case of Brown vs. Board of Education successfully ending racial discrimination in public institutions of higher education. Because of her personal sacrifice in 1956, I was admitted in 1985 and received my bachelors. My sister received her masters and my nephew is now attending the oldest public university in the State of Alabama. Access to higher education is our inheritance and responsibility to ensure that succeeding generations keep this right.
