The people sit

A Reading from the Book of Samuel (8:4-11,[12-15], 16-20, [11:14-15]

All the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah, and said to him, "You are old and your sons do not follow in your ways; appoint for us, then, a king to govern us, like other nations." But the thing displeased Samuel when they said, "Give us a king to govern us." Samuel prayed to the Lord, and the Lord said to Samuel, "Listen to the voice of the people in all that they say to you; for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them. Just as they have done to me, from the day I brought them up out of Egypt to this day, forsaking me and serving other gods, so also they are doing to you. Now then, listen to their voice; only—you shall solemnly warn them, and show them the ways of the king who shall reign over them." So Samuel reported all the words of the Lord to the people who were asking him for a king. He said, "These will be the ways of the king who will reign over you: he will take your sons and appoint them to his chariots and to be his horsemen, and to run before his chariots; and he will appoint for himself commanders of thousands and commanders of fifties, and some to plow his ground and to reap his harvest, and to make his implements of war and the equipment of his chariots. He will take your daughters to be perfumers and cooks and bakers. He will take the best of your fields and vineyards and olive orchards and give them to his courtiers. He will take one-tenth of your

grain and of your vineyards and give it to his officers and his courtiers. He will take your male and female slaves, and the best of your cattle and donkeys, and put them to his work. He will take one-tenth of your flocks, and you shall be his slaves. And in that day you will cry out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves; but the Lord will not answer you in that day." But the people refused to listen to the voice of Samuel; they said, "No! but we are determined to have a king over us, so that we also may be like other nations, and that our king may govern us and go out before us and fight our battles." Samuel said to the people, "Come, let us go to Gilgal and there renew the kingship." So all the people went to Gilgal, and there they made Saul king before the Lord in Gilgal. There they sacrificed offerings of well-being before the Lord, and there Saul and all the Israelites rejoiced greatly.

The Nicene Creed

From the Rector's Desk

Revisiting Electronic Worship – has it endangered our Worship?

(continued)

Last week, I ended this column by suggesting that COVID-19, stole our ability to worship the way we grew accustomed.

Gordon Latrop, who penned the article entitled – Assembly, wondered whether our gatherings as Episcopalians, significantly impacted by the pandemic, will continue as previously experienced. And what if, God forbid, there are more such threats on the horizon! As the pandemic abates (all statistical data seems to suggest this) we still need to exercise caution, particularly those of us who need to be vaccinated. The CDC and local health authorities continue to issue guidelines regarding public gatherings and even for families. Mask wearing has now become optional and in some settings and most of us are becoming more comfortable, and are getting out. So this is a good time to look back and see how worship weathered the storm that gripped us for a year and more – the survival mechanism we resorted to, and may still have to be employed a little while longer. For us here at SMAA and indeed across the denominational divide, pastors/priests and congregational leaders were forced to rely on livestreamed or recorded liturgies. In some instances, the average attendance was reported higher in number than before the pandemic began! Fr. Chris Brathwaite says that he is sure that we will all discover when we look back in time, that COVID-19 was a blessing in disguise – and why -because lots of us were afforded the opportunity to spend time with our families (especially children) and in that regard, acknowledge what teachers have to contend with everyday at the hands of our children! He saw COVID as a mixed blessing for another reason – the return of family worship in the living room, as we sat and watched the liturgy being done from a distance. Bottomline, technology allowed us to assemble and worship, even though we were socially distanced – sometimes real far from each other. So now that we see an abatement, where do we go from here? We still need to remain connected; we still need to hear the gospel proclaimed and we still need to support the work of the church by our weekly/monthly giving. Perhaps the more urgent question is –is there a yearning to return? How much are we missing being present at SMAA? Now that we are gathering again (and it feels safer) when do more of us plan to be present? There will be some of us who will need to continue this distanced

connection to our congregation – hopefully not for too long. The reality is (not only for us), some folks may still want to be able to surf through a variety of digital offerings – sort of easy church shopping. I am told that some of our Episcopal brethren up north, are already deciding that this may become for them, a new way of worshipping, until they all feel free to breathe again. Look out for the conclusion of this discussion next week.
