I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. And I know that such a person-whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows—was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. From the Rector's Desk

Remembering the Past

(continued for last week)

After the service, the congregation moved from Fisk Chapel to St. Anselm's Episcopal Church to bless a memorial marker honoring Grizzard, his brother Henry Grizzard, and Samuel Smith. All three of these African American men were lynched in or nearby Nashville, as Deane discovered with the help of the Equal Justice Initiative. The Rev. Nontombi Naomi Tutu, originally from South African but a Nashville resident of 18 years, gave the service's homily, calling on the church to take ownership of its history and repent for its sins. She prayed:

"Lord we bring before you the Grizzard brothers and Samuel Smith, and we say truly their blood is on our hands, and we come to you asking for forgiveness. Let us remember that in claiming these stones, we are claiming our own humanity, and saying "Yes Lord, we desire a new covenant."

The worship service came after nearly three years of effort within the Episcopal Diocese of Tennessee as they sought to address racism.

Finally in 2015, Nashville's St. Anselm's Episcopal Church sponsored a resolution at the diocese's annual convention calling on church members to pray for the lives of those affected by racism, and instructing those ordained to create opportunities for discussion about racism.

We shall have our own opportunity to atone for what was done to Pierce Taylor (1897), Mick Morris (1909), Richard Hawkins (1937) and Earnest Ponder(1937) at the ceremony planned for July 17, 2021, at 3:00 pm at Cascade Park under the Oak Tree of corner of East Gaines and South Meridian Streets. Do make a special effort to be in attendance.
