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

The Holy Gospel

Sermon

The Nicene Creed

From the Rector's Desk

The Middle Road

On Thursday last, I completed a leadership workshop hosted by the Bishop's Institute for Ministry and Leadership at Camp Weed. It was a three-part series spread over a month's duration. The Rev. Adam Greene, principal at the Episcopal School of Jacksonville was the main presenter, but he was assisted at each session by clergy from the diocese. The whole objective behind this leadership series was to provide us clergy with a roadmap as we seek to discern what church leadership should look like in these turbulent times. I found the topic for session three, somewhat intriguing – "Navigating Polarities." It was an attempt to have us discuss how we minister in the midst of truly polarizing times here in America and what ought to be the style of leadership we present in our parishes and missions, most of which are sharply divided along political, social, and economic lines.

Fr. Adam spoke passionately about his own experience at his school/parish where he has spiritual charge for some 1300 students, 300 staff members and a parent population that spans every social strata of Jacksonville society. Those who manage schools these days are beset by a multitude of problems that sometimes have nothing to do to education. We listened in awe as Adam detailed the pain he often encounters these days, just responding to the demands of parents, such as dealing with the vexing issue of mask wearing that has become so politically toxic, that he had to go to court to defend what he thought was a common sense policy to ensure the safety of his school family! Boy – was he wrong!! So Adam employs what he describes as a survival ethic (walking that fine line) for fear of offending the few. He likens it to a middle of the road strategy. As he spoke, I could not help but remember what they say about us Anglican/Episcopalians – we have an innate ability to come down firmly on both sides of an issue. Fr. Adam characterized it a staying in the middle of the road thereby avoiding the rocks on either side.

In our breakout groups, we were encouraged to critique the Adam approach. When it was my turn, I said to our group, what if Archbishop Desmond Tutu (whom we lost to heaven recently) embraced that middle of the road policy, the apartheid system, would it have just collapsed under its own weight? What if Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. (whom we celebrate next Sunday) just chose to remain in his pulpit rather than march in the streets, do we think the right to vote would have been earlier achieved? And yes, what if Jesus had decided to avoid all conflict with the religious authorities of His day, would we have had a faith? I concluded, sometimes we have to become risk takers, we have to choose one side against another, we have to find the courage to speak our truth.

So as much as I see wisdom in that middle of the road suggestion, the times in which we live require us believers to let our convictions be known, even if it means often putting ourselves at risk.
