THE LESSONS

The people sit

A Reading from the Book of Nehemiah (8:1-3, 5-6, 8-10)

All the people gathered together into the square before the Water Gate. They told the scribe Ezra to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the Lord had given to Israel. Accordingly, the priest Ezra brought the law before the assembly, both men and women and all who could hear with understanding. This was on the first day of the seventh month. He read from it facing the square before the Water Gate from early morning until midday, in the presence of the men and the women and those who could understand; and the ears of all the people were attentive to the book of the law. And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was standing above all the people; and when he opened it, all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people answered, "Amen, Amen," lifting up their hands. Then they bowed their heads and worshiped the Lord with their faces to the ground. So they read from the book, from the law of God, with interpretation. They gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading. And Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, "This day is holy to the Lord your God; do not mourn or weep." For all the people wept when they heard the words of the law. Then he said to them, "Go your way, eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions of them to those for whom nothing is prepared, for this day is holy to our Lord; and do not be grieved, for the joy of the Lord is your strength."

A Reading from the First Epistle to the Corinthians (12:12-31a)

Just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those members of the body that we think less honorable we clothe with greater honor, and our less respectable members are treated with

greater respect; whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? But strive for the greater gifts.

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

On Saving our Young Men and Women

The Capital Area Justice Ministry continues with its research exercise, all in preparation for the planned Nehemiah Assembly in the Spring of '22. Research teams meet with designated individuals from the community who can offer insights, as we closely examine pertinent issues relating to gun violence/law enforcement and affordable housing.

I was part of the team that met with Dr. Kimball Thomas, director of TEMPO (Tallahassee Engaged in Meaningful Productivity for Opportunity). This program targets 16–24-year-olds who would have dropped out of school and are <u>not</u> in the labor force. It was launched in October 2017 and to date has had over 350 participants, who are encouraged to complete their GEDS, and find some form of vocational education licensure or certification, and there by afford themselves an opportunity to make a "living wage" eventually.

Dr. Thomas in his hour-long presentation told those of us gathered, of his being drawn to dropouts, many of whom live in neighborhoods that are primarily crime infested. He described such persons as disconnected youth, who exist by selling drugs and engaging in other forms of nefarious activities. Unsurprisingly, lots of them have felonies and merely drift along aimlessly awaiting an opportunity to make a "quick buck". What was indeed intriguing, was how Dr. Thomas perceived of his mission to these brothers and sisters on the streets. He could have easily focused on his daytime job with the City of Tallahassee, and on Sundays, go preach a nice sermon to his congregants (he is a Primitive Baptist preacher). Instead, he chose to engage with these disconnected youth at great personal risk, for many of his would-be clients had ready access to guns! His motivation—that portion of the gospel where Jesus speaks of the 'least' of his brethren. Because of his courage, conviction, and dedication, many of these disconnected youth are returning to the classroom and finding jobs at Burger King, McDonalds, and Target. Others are enrolled at TCC with the expectation of ending up at FAMU, eventually.

I thank God for Dr. Kimball Thomas who found the intestinal courage and fortitude to go where his faith led him, to help rescue many of our youth who otherwise would be condemned to a life of just "drifting along" and possibly ending up in the criminal justice system.
