

The Person Down the Road



The Election of a Bishop Coadjutor

As we are all aware, our effort back in May, to elect a Bishop coadjutor, failed to receive the approval of the National Church. Let me remind you how this process works. After the election has taken place, whomever emerges as the successful candidate, still needs the consent of the National Church. So that candidate has to receive a two-thirds majority acceptance by the Standing Committee of <u>all</u> dioceses making up the National Church – and it goes without saying, the majority of the Bishops as well.

The Committee of Review (that serves in an advisory capacity to the Presiding Bishop), received a complaint from one third of those who participated in the election held back in May. That committee concluded that the process we used to determine the house of clergy representation, was flawed rendering the results null and void. Hence, efforts are on the way to have another election at a later date. In the meantime, I ask that we all remain in prayers.
