

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

The Hallowtide Triduum

Most Christians know the story how God in Jesus Christ, won the ultimate victory over sin and death and that is why we continue to observe in Holy Week the triduum of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Vigil of Easter. There is something of a comparison to be made, if we link All Hallows Eve, All Saints' Day, and All Souls' Day. The Hallowtide Triduum begins of course with the much-misunderstood observance of Halloween. While it is true that some pagan traditions were held at the same time of the year, Halloween is an inherently Christian occasion and a prelude to a major feast day. So before celebrating the great heroes of the faith on All Saints' Day and commemorating all the faithful departed on All Souls' Day, the church wisely invites us to remember that these are occasions of honoring people who have died. On Halloween, we confront perhaps the most fundamental human fear, our fear of death. From a church's point what is done at Halloween, is a sort of reminder that our God is present and active in the scariest, most uncomfortable moments of our lives, even in the moment of death. On the Feast of All Saints, we celebrate the men and women who heroically committed their lives to Christ - these days all we have to say is – I belong to Jesus, and no one confronts us. In the first century, that was a death sentence you pronounced on yourself! As a reminder, the Feast of All Saints' enjoys the importance/significance as Easter and Christmas and ought to be celebrated with the same flourish. So for those of us who asks but what about my beloved departed family members? The Church responds with All Souls Day, the commemoration of all the faithful departed. Since we do not know if these souls have yet entered the "fullness of the presence of the Lord" or are still growing in his love (BCP 862), in preparation for perfect union with our God, the celebration is muted. All Souls' Day reminds us of the universality of salvation – the unity of Christians in heaven and on earth – our hope is that we will be reunited with our loved ones one day. As is our practice here at SMAA, we will pray for our departed loved ones by name during the service, so please still send in those names, you want to be prayed for. A final thought, this service of All Souls might be a particularly good opportunity for catharsis and maybe even closure, for those who were not able to attend services for loved ones/friends/church members even here at St. Michael's an account of the pandemic.
