

Celebrating Fred Hickman

I suppose when we gather as a parish family on December 10th, we will hear more tributes paid to this remarkable man who became part although briefly, of the SMAA family. Sheila (former junior warden) shared with me, a story from the New York Times celebrating Fred's life and yes, legacy. As Richard Sandomir reminds his readers, Fred was a skilled and affable journalist, one of first Black individuals to anchor a national cable sports broadcast on CNN, where he worked for 21 years. Fred became a sports anchor at CNN when the network started in 1980 and gained praise early on for his interviews with sports figures, including Frank Robinson, whom he pressed on the racial issues facing baseball, before his first season as manager of the San Francisco Giants. Within a few months, the network teamed Fred with Nick Charles on "Sports Tonight", competing directly with ESPN's Sports Center. The Nick and Hick combo became an entertaining and popular pairing, anchoring a half-hour of news, analysis, and highlights on weeknights at 11:00 pm until 1997, with one two-year interruption in the mid 1980's. Here's an interesting tib-bit – during CNN's coverage of the fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989, Fred Hickman watched a man hold up a sign that alluded to a regular "Sports Tonight" feature – Fred on CNN and it read, "United Germany the Play of the Day."

Here are some personal details – Frederick Douglas Hickman was born on October 17, 1956, in Springfield, III. His father, George was the head of maintenance at Abraham Lincoln Capital Airport in Springfield, while his mother, Louise (Bush) Hickman, worked for the State of Illinois. Fred was the program and music director of the campus radio station at Coe College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, from which he graduated in 1978 with a bachelor's degree in sociology. After a stint at a radio station in Springfield, he was hired as a news anchor and sports reporter on the Springfield television station WICS. Then it was on to CNN and after a brief hiatus, returned to the network. In 2000, Fred gained notoriety when it was revealed that he had cast the only vote against Shaquille O'Neal for the NBA's Most Valuable Player Award. That choice led to anonymous threats of personal harm because of his choice.
