FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Pentecost Sunday occurs fifty days after Easter.

Pentecost Sunday is where the church of Jesus (the) Christ celebrates and commemorates the Holy Spirit's descent on the apostles, causing them to speak in their own language (or tongues, not glossolalia). Always remember that in the Bible "tongues" always refer to foreign languages. Today, however, speaking in "tongues" is believed to be a type of gibberish created when the Holy Spirit enters a person. This was what the apostle Paul was speaking against in I Corinthians 14 regarding orderly worship and the gifts of prophesy vs tongues. ("But in the church would rather speak five intelligible words to instruct others than ten thousand words in a tongue". (I Cor. 14.19).

Christians all around the world observe the Day of Pentecost because it marks the birth of the church and the moment when the Holy Spirit (the third Person of the Trinity) came upon the apostles and empowered them to speak the Gospel of Jesus (the) Christ to the world, and some 3,000 believers were brought into the Church. Pentecost Sunday is a sign of renewal and a reflection on the power, presence, provision, and proficiency of the Holy Spirit in our lives, a reminder that we all (Jews, Christians, and Muslims) have been called to share our faith with others. Indeed, it all started with Pentecost- the day the Holy Spirit ("pneuma") entered that upper room occupied by Jesus's followers.

Today, Pentecost Sunday is celebrated to recognize the gift of the Holy Spirit, realizing that God's very life, breath, and energy live in us believers. The challenge facing us modern saints is recognizing we believers must continue sharing the essential message about our risen Savior who supernaturally appeared to the fear filled disciples. Pentecost Sunday is a reminder to believers how his peace and presence has given the church the duty (Matt. 28.19-20) to spread the gospel, locally and globally. Jesus said, "As the Father has sent Me. I am sending you", then Jesus breathed on them and they received the Holy Spirit (John 20.23). The church catholic should use Pentecost Sunday, among many other things, to celebrate and confirm the diversity of cultures and languages within the church. Furthermore, the church, individually and corporately, should use Pentecost Sunday as a time to work altruistically at alleviating poverty around the world and donating to local organizations as a way of sharing God's love with others. The church must move from away from using the Holy Spirit as a time for being whipped up in the mixing bowl of contrived emotionalism to that of what our ancestors did during the high days of slavery by taking the crumbs of their meager existence and producing a loaf of hope.
