

#### From the Recor's Desk

# **Challenges facing the Church**

I read maybe a week and half ago an article written by Jake Meador, in which he examined in careful detail the challenges facing the Christian Church. He begins by pointing out that millions of Americans have stopped attending church and wondered what would entice them to return. He centered his attention primarily on the Sunday morning worshipers—those who faithfully attended whether rain or shine. Now he says, so many of them (post COVID) are simply staying away, claiming tiredness after long hours of work (trying to keep up with the bills), and the need for family time. Says Meador, if you have four little ones at the house, then you can better understand the plight of such mothers in particular.

Then he pivots and examines what others have done after the fear of COVID abated. The family reunions have returned, and many are traveling long trips across the nation to gather with family while others are making overseas trips to the European continent in particular, while some are heading to Alaska even Hawaii! However, those who are not traveling somehow are "dechurching" for a multiplicity of reasons, not least being the corporate image of the church with high maintenance bills that leave little room for real outreach to the poor and needy. He argues that some parishioners have difficulty in differentiating between what happens in the corporate world and what passes for church these days with some competing for the attention of politicians looking for a captive audience. Our country is now so divided along political lines that the writer is left wondering about the wisdom of such church leaders. Jake Meador states that many traditionalists are fuming at this contemporary approach by some, and therefore feel no guilt when they stay at home these days. Admittedly they miss the coffee hour(and the gossip), but agree that they are discovering other opportunities for fellowship that Sunday mornings traditionally afforded. Some have settled on watching "worship from home", enjoying live-stream services even beyond their own denominations. Others have concluded that church is not what it used to be, so they are content to withhold their presence and their pockets. Such is the plight of a number of congregations these days with several wondering how do they sustain their presence or do what the gospel demand of them.
