

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

A Meditation (the conclusion)

Though I know beyond a shadow of a doubt I am not the cause of all the hostilities, hatred, and bigotry currently on the world stage, as the R & B singer the late Isaac Hayes put it, "I Stand Accused", and I must check and clean around my own front door. Though my life life's journey is surrounded by small enemies and retarded and restricted by so many obstacles, I know that right is still on my side. I have learned also that the light at the end of the tunnel is not light of another train coming to derail you. Instead, that is the light of the liberation from the LORD taking you to a higher ground of hope and healing. Yet, I must constantly look at myself in the mirror and say, "It's Not My Sister, But Me O LORD" Standing In Need from You".

The prophet Isaiah, in chapter 59, issues his call to every born-again believer to look into the mirror of the Word of God for a reality check, so as to find out what is the real problem at hand. Did not the apostle Paul remind the church at Rome that "all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (Romans. 7.23). Therefore, the reality challenge check for you and me is to allow the Scriptures to show us the problem is not in our life and living, but rather our booster living out God's plan and purpose for your life (Jer. 29.11). So, instead of you asking why God has not rescued you from your trials, tribulations, and tragedies of life, or has God removed His favor and friendship from you, or whether or not God's arms have become shortened where He is no longer able to box with your pain, your problems, and your predicament, just trust Him for what He is able to do.

After a meticulous reading of Isaiah 59, it becomes clear from the prophet that none of the above are true. This text lands squarely in the face of the incorrect hermeneutics of those who argue, if God is the God of love why is there so much human suffering. The prophet Isaiah hits the nail squarely on the head when he says the issue has nothing to do with God being all- powerful, but rather are we as believers doing and living right? Are we as faithful followers of the crucified Guru from Galilee truly know that if God be for us, who can be against us? Just remember the words of the prophet Isaiah when he proclaimed: "Behold, the LORD's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither His ear heavy, that it cannot hear."
