

The vestry is getting ready to prepare our 2024 parish budget. To assist them, we can submit our pledge cards. The vestry is truly grateful to those who have responded thus far and would like to encourage the rest of us to do likewise.

What The Messiah Will Do—(Isaiah 61.1-4, 8-11)

Now that the decorations are down and done with, the colorful lights are no longer lingering, and the plastic money payments will soon come due, my query for the church of God in Christ is, has the modern church catholic become a cheerleader for this over commercialization enterprise? Or, has the church become a major messenger of revenue, rituals, and a ringside participant of this secular annual economic boost? Has the modern church abdicated her precious platform of witnessing about God's greatest and genuine gift to humankind- God's only begotten Son to be the sacrificial Lamb for the sins of our soul? Christmas in America is a multi-billion enterprise, where even during the pandemic holiday sales reached \$859 billion in 2022. Retailers rely heavily on fourth quarter sales to drive their earning. Americans spent \$975 for Christmas gifts, up from \$867 in 2022. Yet, poverty in America is simply alarming and aloft, where America has the highest overall poverty rate among the 26 developed nations. Though America's wealth has the highest standards of living of the middle and upper ends of the income distribution, our children are at the lower end and their standard of living falls behind most other industrialized nations. According to the Census Bureau's latest American Community Survey- a set of data that often flies under the public radar- nearly 41 million people in the United States lived below the poverty line in 2022. That is nearly 1.5 million more people than in 2019, before the pandemic. It is an embarrassment before God this economic poverty picture stood before God in 2023.

Dr. Charles R. Swindoll, Chancellor Emeritus, Dallas Theological Seminary said: "Ever since the first Christmas celebration, I think one word has fallen from everyone's lips..... It (is not) the word joy or carol or tree or food. It's the word gift. Gifts are so inseparably linked and interwoven with Christmas that we can hardly think of one without the other. However, the church catholic needs to establish a priority. With all of the giving and receiving that happens at Christmas, it seems appropriate that we first think about God's gift of us." Has the modern-day churches gift giving been more about Santa, and less about our Savior? Has the modern-day churches gift giving been more about a tree, and less about the Truth? Has the modern-day churches gift giving been more about house decoration, and less about heart duty, discipline, and discipleship? Has the modern-day churches song been more about "Jack Frost nipping at your nose" or the Spirit of the living God seeking to nourish your soul? The church of God in Christ must abandon this over commercialized Christmas and reclaim and recapture the message of God greatest gift to the world: For God so loved the world that, He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes Him shall not perish, but have eternal life" (Jn. 3.16).
