

What The Messiah Will Do (Isaiah 61.4-4, 8-11)

Continued from last week

It is from the above lectionary lesson from the Old Testament reading text the prophet Isaiah 61.1-4,8-11 I pause to pray and petition my fellow believers to re-examine our observance and celebration of the one and only gift that matters- Christ Jesus. Here in the Book of Isaiah, the "Mount Everest of Hebrew prophecy", we read about how Christ Jesus is in the synagogue in Nazareth (Lk. 4.16-21), highlighted God's gift to His children. Christ Jesus came to meet the spiritual needs of the people and "to proclaim the acceptable year of the LORD." Because of God's gift of His Son Jesus, we are living today in God's "year of acceptance," the day of grace. Christ Jesus is God's gift to all humanity to convert our "funerals" into a fanfare of a joyous "wedding". Verse 3 pictures the mourners drying their tears and putting on festive garments instead of mourning clothes. Verse 10 describes the nation rejoicing as the bride and the bridegroom "clothes" God's spiritually naked people in salvation and righteousness. Listed below are four gracious gifts I challenge each of you consider giving to both family and friends and even your foes this Epiphany season. These four gifts are priceless, but precious; costless, but critical; invisible, but invaluable; and quaint, but quintessential. I ask that every born-again believer in the body of Christ who desires to be a unique voice of hope and healing in the land to commit Jesus' promise to His church to memory and share during this holy season:

- "to bring good news to the captives" (v.10)
- "to bind up the brokenhearted" (v.1)
- "to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners" (v.1)
- "to proclaim the year of the LORD'S favor, and the day of vengeance to our God" (v.2)

Notwithstanding life's country people and their circumstances, it is incumbent upon the church of God in Christ to share the prophet's proclamation about this delight and rejoicing, salvation and righteousness, sprawling and sprouting with praise- all because of God's gift of His begotten Son to the people that is centered, concentrated, and concretized in Jesus of God's gift of His own presence. God's of His Son for our salvation, but also, we receive the gift of God's presence, which is undeserved, unmerited, and unearned.
