FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

A New Beginning

The Standing Committee under the leadership of the Reverend Teresa Seagel invited us as a Diocese yesterday to gather at Camp Weed and the Cerveny Conference Center for a Convocation. Why a convocation some have asked? Well those of us who came away disappointed twice that we were unable to elect a successor to Bishop Howard, have no doubt become somewhat disenchanted at our failure to accomplish that which we have done effortlessly in the past—maybe except for 2003 when the Episcopal Church almost came apart at the seams. Back to the present, the Standing Committee appointed a Steering Committee with the intention of gathering the diocese together for the purpose of healing and reconciliation—we need to achieve both. That committee decided (the Rev. Joe Gibbs, leader) that our situation will be better served if we have a series of convocations/conversations, so we can grapple with what ails us as a diocese—for indeed it has taken decades for us to reach this level of brokenness which we are experiencing today. What we do know is that healing will not happen overnight and will certainly be difficult work—hence the three convocations planned.

To facilitate the good order, debate, and a non-acrimonious atmosphere, both clergy and lay chaplains were invited to serve, so that the processes undertaken will lead to the reconciliation between groups and individual members in attendance, our wider diocesan family, and the Episcopal Church. Our parish was represented by James Fort and Kimberly Douglas, while I served as one of the chaplains. Do continue to pray for our Diocesan family and indeed the wider Episcopal Church.
