Lent is Here!

I pose this challenge to all of us this Lenten Season—let us seek to read more, reflect more, and pray more—leaving behind the daily distractions of our lives. I bid you pray for the grace to so do. I came across this provocative reflection by one Rachel Held Evans who described herself as an ex-evangelist—read on and you will see why great doubt crept into her life, but also how she was delivered:-They said that if I questioned a 6000 year old earth, I would question whether other parts of Scripture should be read scientifically and historically. They were right! I did. They said that if I entertained the hope that those without access to the gospel might still be loved and saved by God, I would fall prey to the dangerous idea that God loves everyone, that there is nothing God won't do to reconcile all things to Himself. They were right. I have. They said that if I looked for Jesus beyond the party line, I could end up voting for liberals. They were right. I do (sometimes). They said that if I listened to my gay and lesbians neighbors, if I made room for them in my church and in my life, I could let grace get out of hand. They were right. It has. They told me that this slippery slope would lead me away from God, that it would bring a swift end to my faith journey, that I'd be lost forever. But with that one, they were wrong. Yes, the slippery slope brought doubts. Yes, the slippery slope brought change. Yes, the slippery slope brought danger and risk and unknowns. I am indeed more exposed to the elements out here, and at times it is hard to find footing. But when I decided I wanted to follow Jesus as myself, with both my head and heart intact the slippery slope was the only place I could find Him, the only place I could engage my faith honestly.

The Power and Practice of Love

Continued from last week.

Listen to what the apostle John said in his epistle, I John 4.20: "If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar, for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen? To love God, you must show love for others." I'm impressed with this passage because John does not just use the Greek word **telei** (which has the idea of "maturity" and "completeness"). Instead, he writes **teleioo teleioo**- speaking of love that is "perfectly perfected" or "completely completed". John insists that our claim of loving God is false if we do not also love our sister and brother in the family of faith and it must be seen in action.

In 2024, let us come to the starting line of another new year, the race with a radically new mindset to show and express love in open with how we will practice and participate loving more openly and visibly. According to both John and Jesus, our claim of loving God is false, phony, and fictious if we do not also love our brothers and sisters. This love must be seen, placed in action, and exemplary of the love of Christ Jesus. Jesus said to His disciples, after having communed and washed their feet, the world could measure our status as His disciples by the measure of our love for one another (John 13.35).

Love is not limited to nor confined by what it says, Instead, love has everything to do with what it does. Perhaps the television mogul Oprah Winfrey said it best: "Lots of people want to ride with you in the limo, but what you want is someone who will take the bus with you when the limo breaks down." Let's prepare to show the world, that in 2024, the church of God in Christ's love life is under new management. If not, the immortal words of Dr. King will become a living reality: "We must learn how to live together as sisters and brothers, or we will perish together as fools."
