

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

"Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace".

We have heard no doubt many a sermon related to the gospel story for today, where Jesus made a whip of cords and drove out the animals in the temple, overturned the tables of the money changers and literally lost His mind! I suppose no matter how often we read this portion of scripture, we are perhaps left asking ourselves as believers, are we guilty too of profaning what is "Holy" in our midst? The answer is an uncomfortable yes! Well think Christmas for a moment, that has become an orgy of spending in an attempt to meet needs that cannot be satisfied with money. Or marriage for that matter—it is a sacrament and therefore Holy. And yet forty percent of Christian marriages today (may be more), end in divorce—a sad indictment some say on the church. Of course when someone is trapped in a marriage with an abusive or alcoholic spouse, divorce might be the best of the two unhappy options. I often ponder the unseemly amount of monies expended nowadays for these fanciful weddings, particularly the destination ones!

If we can leave that aside for now and consider the piercing questions posed in the second reading we have for today (1 Cor. 1:18-25), where the Apostle Paul speaks of the treatment of our human bodies. In his letters to the church at Corinth, Paul told the Corinthians to avoid prostitutes, because their bodies were holy, temples in which the Holy Spirit did dwell (2 Cor 6:16-20). So my question for us Michaelites today is, shouldn't we honor God by taking care of our bodies? Shouldn't we not only avoid prostitutes, but also eat modestly and exercise reasonably? Shouldn't we see a doctor to get a physical examination every now and then? Or for that matter our language— we use the word profanity to mean "curse words". Often, we ignore what the 10 commandments instruct, that is, not to profane God's name, by using it or Jesus's as swear words—of course those other words we are often tempted to use, I cannot repeat them here! Suffice it to say, if we fill our mouths and ears with garbage, I promise you that that garbage is sure to poison our hearts and minds. As Jesus tried to say in that symbolic act of righteous anger, we can take something that is holy and make it unholy instead. Think on these things beloved as we continue to observe the Lenten Season.
