GOOD FRIDAY

This is the Friday before Easter on which the anniversary of the Crucifixion is kept. Historically, it has been a day of fasting, abstinence and penance. The service is in three parts—(1) the lessons and prayers, the reading of the Passion (according to John), (ii), the divine prayers, (iii) communion from the Altar of Repose. Most churches (except for the traditional types) have dispensed with three hour Service from noon until 3:00 pm.

In the Orthodox Church, this day is known as the "Great Friday". The liturgical celebrations consist of the Divine Office—Matins and the chanting of the "Twelve Gospels" (i.e. 12 passages drawn the Passion narratives of all four gospels). Most times the service concludes with the Veneration of the Cross ritual.
