FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

The Feast of the Ascension

On Thursday of last week, the Feast of the Ascension was observed across Christendom, although not with the same fanfare and fuss as we did previously. The statement in the Creeds that Christ 'ascended into heaven' is based mainly on Acts 1:1-9, where after 40 days of appearances, the Risen Lord speaks to the Apostles about the coming of the Holy Spirit and the Church's mission, and is then taken up in a cloud. The reference to the Apostles' return to Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives (Acts 1:12), gave rise to the tradition that this is where the ascension took place. However, the gospel of Luke (LK 24:50-53) seems to imply this event took place at Bethany on the evening of the day of the Resurrection. So these accounts vary in their reporting, but all combine to show that for the Early Church, God had vindicated Jesus after His crucifixion and exalted and granted Him a place in heaven, where He remains seated at the right hand of God in glory.

For Christians in every age, the Ascension marks the solemn close of the post-Resurrection appearances and signifies Jesus' rule for all time to come until the Parousia, when He returns to judge "the quick and the dead."

Finally, despite its low keyed observance these days, Ascension remains for us, one of the chief feasts of the Christian year. So yes, Ascension is observed on the sixth Thursday (i.e. the 40th. day after Easter). In earlier times, its observance was frequently, if not always, marked by a procession at the Eucharist, to commemorate Jesus' journey to the Mount of Olives. The Paschal Candle, that was lit at every mass during Easter, was always extinguished on the day of the Ascension.
